- Floods and flash floods
- Forecasting and nowcasting of severe weather
- Severe weather forecast training
- Satellite studies of storms and their environment
- Radar studies of storms
- Storm electrification, lightning, microphysics and hail
- Storm climatologies, risk assessments and climate change
- Collection of storm data, historical events and damage assessments

The decision will be communicated to the applicants by mid-May 2017. The lump sum of EUR 500 will be transferred to the account of the awardees within two weeks after the ECSS2017. A confirmation of attendance sheet needs to be signed by the awardees on the conference site.
